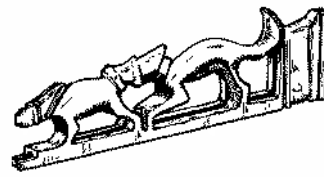

### **Kirby Hall Northamptonshire Sunday 27th June.**

Kirby Hall is one of England's greatest Elizabethan Houses. Begun by Sir Humphrey Stafford in 1570, it was purchased by Sir Christopher Hatton one of Queen Elizabeth's "comely young men" and later Lord Chancellor. He spent a small fortune on the house hoping to attract his Queen to visit. In this he failed but he and his successors have left a record of cutting edge architectural design and style for us to enjoy.

We believe the house is of special interest to this Society as a comparison to the Amphill Castle. The fine gardens, recently restored, are home to peacocks.

Cost is £5.30 per person or £4.50 Concessions, Family Ticket £13.30, English Heritage members free.  
There is an additional cost of £3.00 pp for the conducted tour.

Audio guides are available but we shall book a group guide for the house and garden providing the response is big enough.

Unfortunately there is no cafe, but picnicking is welcome in the grounds & snacks are available on site.  
We suggest meeting at 1.00 p.m. for a picnic in time for the tour at 2.00 p.m.
